

The relics of Kateri
may be seen at
Caughnawaga.
They are kept in
a glass-covered
wooden chest
in a little hall
off the Sacristy
of the Mission Church.

Above it
appears
a hand-carved statue
of Kateri Tekakwitha.

To the left
may be seen
Father de Charlevoix'
writing table
which he used in 1722
— to take notes on
the Lily of the Mohawks

His work, the
"History of New France"
published in 1744,
stands upon the desk.

On the wall
hangs the wampum belt
sent to the Mission
by the Hurons
in 1677,
the same year
Kateri Tekakwitha
arrived.

Known as the
sermon-belt,
it teaches that the
Commandments of God
and of the Church
lead to the Cross,
the Door of Paradise.
